



## **BUILDING CONSTRUCTIONS - ENGLISH COURSES**

### **INFORMATION ABOUT EVALUATION OF THE SEMESTER PERFORMANCE WITH SPECIAL (PANDEMIC) CIRCUMSTANCES IN SPRING SEMESTER 2020/21.**

#### **INTRODUCTION**

Regarding to the extraordinary circumstances, the Department of Building Constructions will apply the following rules and measurements during spring semester 2021 with approval of CAO (Central Academic Office) including some derogation from the Code of Studies and Exams of BME.

#### **GENERAL**

##### **Methods of performance evaluation**

The students' performance is basically evaluated by their inter-semester performance. Calculated according to Subject Requirements and the method described below, an offered mark is given (same as signature mark), that can be accepted as the final grade without exam. If the offered mark is refused, exam must be taken and the final grade is calculated from the exam mark and the signature mark according to Subject Requirements of each course.

#### **1. Performance evaluation during the semester:**

##### **TESTS AND SEMESTER PROJECTS**

The requirements of the signature and calculation of the signature mark are defined Requirements and Course Data Sheet of each subject and did not change in frames of distance learning. Tests, semester projects and extra points are taken into account for the signature mark (same offered mark) with the same weight (50-50%) as in regular semesters.

As this is a semester starting with distance learning from the beginning, no allowance is given.

- In case of late submission -10% of penalty will be taken into account.
- No Extra Supplementary Occasion for semester project submission or test repetition will be held for technical problems (besides the scheduled late submissions and test repetitions in the Schedule of each subject.)
- Tests and Semester projects must be handed in strictly via TEAMS ASSIGNMENT. No other ways can be accepted and evaluated by the Department.

For further information about subject requirements and deadlines please review thoroughly Requirements and Subject Data Sheet, Time Schedule and Semester project description of each subject.

## **2. OFFERED MARK INSTEAD OF EXAM**

This semester, exams defined in Requirements and the Course Data Sheet are replaced by offered marks (not setting a precedent) for every student who fulfilled requirements of the signature in the subject during the ongoing semester in frames of distance learning.

**The offered final grade of the semester is calculated by weighted average of the tests and the semester projects (in case of late submission -10% of penalty will be taken into account).**

Offered mark is not obligatory to be accepted. Accepting the offered mark means it will be the final grade of the semester, no further exam must be taken. Accepting the offered mark is declared by registration to a special 'technical exam occasion' is dedicated for offered marks via NEPTUN. Any other registration means the refusal of the offered mark. The refusal of the offered mark is automatic by registering to normal exam occasion, no need to announce or apply it.

Offered mark can't be given repeatedly. In case of refusing it by a registration to a normal, common exam occasion, the credit can be achieved exclusively only by taking the exam. There is no way of validation of offered mark after registration to normal exam occasion or taken exam with unsuccessful or lower graded result.

## **3. Performance evaluation during the examination period: ORAL EXAMS INSTEAD OF WRITTEN EXAMS**

The option of offered mark doesn't concern to students on exam courses (course code „ENV” in Neptun system). Exam course students and those who refuse offered mark will have to participate on oral exam in this semester.

The exam consists of 5 questions to be answered orally via TEAMS meeting with audio and video connection. Each question is evaluated by marks. The result of the exam is calculated by the weighted average of the questions' grade. In case of 3 failed questions out of 5, the exam is not succeeded. In case of successful oral exam, the subject's final grade is calculated by the average of the overall semester result and the oral exam.
